### 2012 Global Youth Service Day: April 20 – 22



ServeNebraska is proud to have been chosen by [Youth Service America](#) as a lead agency for [Global Youth Service Day](#). In line with our mission of mobilizing Nebraskans to strengthen their communities through volunteering, collaboration, and national service programs ServeNebraska conducted a mini-grant process to maximize the involvement of youth in communities across our state. Applications were sought from youth-serving groups and organizations for projects uniting community involvement with service learning.

#### [Stand for the Silent: Anti-Bullying Initiative](#)

The statewide Stand for the Silent Anti-Bullying Initiative is the signature event of ServeNebraska's 2012 Global Youth Service Day efforts. On April 20, 2012, schools and groups have the opportunity to get involved by taking a pledge to combat bullying and participating in 7 seconds of silence followed by a balloon release reflecting the statistic that every 7 seconds someone is bullied. Participating schools and youth service organizations receive balloons and pledge cards from the generous support of sponsoring entities including the [Oriental Trading Company](#). A \$200 Global Youth Service mini-grant was awarded to support this effort.

### Mini-Grant Awards

Facilitated by ServeNebraska, the [ServeNebraska InterCorps Council \(ICC\)](#), a leadership council of AmeriCorps members and AmeriCorps\*VISTAs in service throughout Nebraska, took the lead in coordinating the Mini-Grant Process. Members assisted in the creation of the application; rallied their communities to participate in Global Youth Service Day and apply Mini-Grants; and conducted a thorough and deliberative consensus-based grant review process. Leading these efforts for the ICC was Katie Brokaw, an AmeriCorps member in service with College Possible in Omaha.

A total of **\$3,675** in 2012 Global Youth Service Day Mini-Grant funding was awarded to applicants by ServeNebraska in two project areas – Youth Service (**\$2,200**) and Disability

Youth Service (**\$1,475**). ServeNebraska received grant funds from the [State Farm Foundation](#) to be a Lead Agency for Global Youth Service Day in Nebraska as designated by Youth Service America and grant funds from the [Corporation for National & Community Service](#) for disability and inclusion services.

The Hart of the Matter as a service learning program teaches "typical" school age children compassion and sensitivity towards others. It helps to build awareness of peers that have various physical and mental disabilities. Cooperatively all youth create a mural as large as a normal sized gymnasium with the use of adaptive equipment. Art tools that hook up to wheelchairs help participants with limited movement or lack of fine motor skills be successful in creating artwork they have never been able to before.
