ServeNebraska is developing an Citizen Corps Online Registry to create a comprehensive accurate knowledge base of volunteers trained and engaged in disaster preparedness in our state. The Online Registry will assist first responders and others in mobilizing volunteers in times of emergency or disaster. It will also include a listing of Citizen Corps Trainers, making it easier for local officials to contact trainers to organize educational activities in their area.

To gauge the preparedness level of Nebraska families and residents, ServeNebraska is posing questions through the Nebraska Annual Social Indicators Survey conducted by the University of Nebraska Bureau of Sociological Research. The Indicators Survey is an omnibus telephone study of quality of life in the state of Nebraska.

Survey results will be shared widely and used to develop future efforts to grow the readiness of all Nebraskans - with a special emphasis on vulnerable populations such as the elderly, those with disabilities, and non-English speakers.
