Governor makes new appointments to the ServeNebraska Volunteer Service Commission

Lincoln, Neb. – The Governor announced recently that he has appointed two new commissioners to serve on the ServeNebraska – Nebraska Volunteer Service Commission. The two new commissioners are Anastazia Bauer Scheer and Drew Graham.

Bauer Scheer currently serves as HR manager at Boys Town in Omaha, Neb. She started with the organization and has held various roles since 2013. Through her prior work as a program manager with Partnership 4 Kids (one of 10 AmeriCorps programs in the state) she gained expertise which gives her insight as a ServeNebraska Commissioner.

Graham is the city attorney for the City of Nebraska City. Having graduated from the University of Nebraska, College of Law in Lincoln, Neb., he is licensed to practice in both Nebraska and Kansas.
