Grants of up to **\$700** are available to non-profit organizations, schools, clubs, and youth-serving organizations. Projects may take place at any point during Nebraska Volunteer Week, April 19-25, 2026.

Nebraska consistently ranks among the top states for volunteer participation nationwide. These grants are designed to strengthen that tradition by empowering young people with hands-on opportunities to serve their communities and build lifelong civic engagement.
